## Top of the Rock

John D. Rockefeller, Jr. first opened the Observation Deck atop 30 Rockefeller Center in 1933 to give something back to New Yorkers and their visitors from around the world – a place to appreciate and celebrate the city. Now, for the first time in 20 years, this breathtaking vantage point is being re-introduced to the people of New York and the world.

Top of the Rock is a streamlined, uncluttered and thrilling experience - with panels of fully transparent, non-reflective safety glass allowing completely unobstructed, open-air views of the entire city. A New York City landmark for nearly 75 years, Rockefeller Center is located in the heart of Manhattan and home to broadcast studios, shops, restaurants, an ice-skating rink, and Radio City Music Hall.
